Terms and conditions of participation

Selection

- 1. Participation is on selection and free of charge. The number of places available is limited (24 places). Participants should have a working knowledge of English.
- 2. Interested court staff may register via their respective national training institutions. Interested bailiffs may register via UEHJ. Applications should be submitted before <u>8 December 2023</u>. A response will be sent to every applicant after this deadline. We advise you not to book any travel or hotel before you receive our confirmation.

Travel and Accommodation

3. Participants will receive a fixed contribution towards their travel expenses and are asked to book their own travel. The condition for payment of this contribution is to sign all attendance sheets at the event. No supporting documents are needed. The amount of the contribution will be determined by the **EU unit cost calculation guidelines**, which are based on the distance from the participant's place of work to the seminar location and will not take account of the participant's actual travel costs.

Travel costs from outside Belgium (distance more than 400km): participants can calculate the contribution to which they will be entitled on the European Commission website (https://eracomm.eu/go/calculator). The distance should be calculated from their place of work to the seminar location. For a distance less than 400km, please consult p.11 on https://eracomm.eu/go/unit-cost-decision-travel.

For those travelling within Belgium, the contribution for travel is fixed at €46 (for a distance between 50km and 400km). Please note that no contribution will be paid for travel under 50km. For more information, please consult p.10 on https://era-comm.eu/go/unit-cost-decision-travel.

- 4. Accommodation will be booked and paid for directly by the organiser for three nights for international participants and national participants travelling more than 50km one-way.
- 5. Successful applicants will be sent the relevant claim form and information on how to obtain payment of the contribution to their expenses. Please note that no payment is possible if the registered participant cancels their participation for any reason.

Other services

6. Beverages consumed during the event, three lunches and two joint dinners are offered by the organiser. No per diems will be offered. Participants will receive a seminar documentation.

- 7. Participation at the whole seminar is required and participants' presence will be recorded.
- 8. A list of participants including each participant's address will be made available to all participants unless ERA receives written objection from the participant no later than one week prior to the beginning of the event.
- 9. The participant will be asked to give permission for their address and other relevant information to be stored in ERA's database in order to provide information about future ERA events, publications and/or other developments in the participant's area of interest.
- 10. A certificate of attendance will be distributed at the end of the seminar.
